



Michigan Tuition Grant Fact Sheet Academic Year 2008-09



Description

The Michigan Tuition Grant program is available to Michigan residents with financial need who plan to attend or are attending independent, degree-granting Michigan postsecondary institutions.

Application

Applicants must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Students who file by March 1 will receive priority consideration. Students are encouraged to file their FAFSA on the Web at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Paper forms are available from the Federal Student Aid Information Center by calling 1-800-4-FEDAID, or a printable version can be accessed on the Web site www.federalstudentaid.ed.gov. Students must file a renewal FAFSA every year to determine possible continued program eligibility. **Students are responsible for notifying the Office of Scholarships and Grants (OSG) of a change in their college choice.**

Program Limits

Awards are restricted to tuition and mandatory fees. Awards pay up to a maximum of \$2,100 per academic year. Students may receive the equivalent of ten (10) semesters or 15 terms of full-time assistance as an undergraduate and six (6) semesters or nine (9) terms for graduate studies. Future awards are subject to available and approved funding.

Eligibility *Failure to meet these requirements will result in the cancellation of your award.*

- Demonstrate financial need
- Enroll at least half time at an approved independent, degree-granting Michigan postsecondary institution
- Possess a high school diploma or GED certificate or meet the institution's Ability to Benefit Standards
- Be a Michigan resident since July 1 of the previous calendar year
- Be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or approved refugee
- Meet institution's satisfactory academic progress (SAP) policy
- Not be incarcerated
- Cannot be enrolled in a course of study leading to a degree in theology, divinity, or religious education
- Not be in default on a federal student loan

Other Gift Aid

It is the responsibility of the college financial aid office to coordinate all sources of aid for which you may be eligible. Other gift aid may reduce or cancel this award.
