



# MIOSHA Construction - Part 45 Fall Protection

## 1 Who Should Attend . . .

Courses are offered throughout the state in sponsorship with other M-TEC<sup>SM</sup> facilities, community colleges, and safety and health organizations. Attendees at this training will review the MIOSHA Part 45, Construction Safety Standard for Fall Protection including the latest OSHA and MIOSHA interpretations. Examination of recent fatal falls in construction and discussion of the latest fall protection techniques for construction will be covered. This class will also cover fall exposures for residential construction and MIOSHA fall protection criteria. Additionally there will be an explanation of the MIOSHA agency instruction for residential construction, a video on residential fall protection, and detailed instructions for builders, followed by a question and answer period.

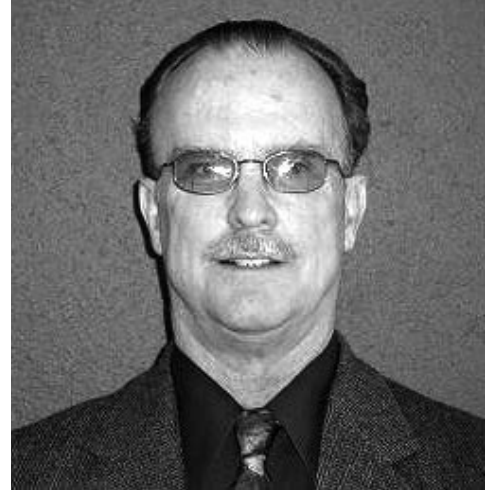
